## **Our Impact**

Vitalize Kitsap provides direct and indirect benefits to our community. When teens and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) join our daily programming, they are empowered to pursue their own dreams, their families and caregivers are able to focus on their personal life goals, and our entire Kitsap County community culture becomes more inclusive and equitable.

VK serves people from around Kitsap County, with members from Bainbridge Island, Bremerton, Indianola, Kingston, Lofall, Poulsbo, Port Orchard, Seabeck, and Silverdale. We even have a member join our Zoom Clubs from Portland, Oregon each week.

VK members range in age from 16 to 70 years old. Many join VK during high school and stay with us throughout the rest of their lives.

Hundreds of community members are also beneficiaries of our meaningful programs. Through community events and activities, such as our booth selling homemade crafts at the BIMA Art Market, bowling, museum visits, and partnerships with other nonprofits, we help create a caring culture of inclusion. We all benefit when everyone is welcome in our public and workspaces.

In 2022, VK delivered 13,000 service hours








## **Disability Demographics**

All VK members have an intellectual or developmental disability (I/DD). VK is the only organization in North Kitsap that serves the needs of people with I/DD who also have physical disabilities. Members have a range of diagnoses:



VK includes everyone with I/DD, accommodating all forms of communication and mobility methods. Our trained staff support members with all of their personal care and life skills independence needs. We aid members experiencing:

## **Our Daily Programs**

We offer a variety of daily programming to meet the diverse interests and goals of our members.

# Adventures & Activities

This is our classic Vitalize Kitsap program. Our staff works with VK members to develop daily programming that empowers members to reach their individual goals in 7 important life areas: Art & Culture, Communication, Community, Continuing Education, Health & Fitness, Life & Job Skills, and Relationships. We have been providing this individualized program for 22 years.

#### Zoom Clubs

We started our Zoom Clubs early on during the pandemic, so we could all stay safely connected from home. VK members and their families loved them so much, they're still a regular part of our weekly programming even now that we're also meeting in person. Our Zoom Clubs combat social isolation and build robust connections between everyone who participates.

### Community Engagement

VK staff work one-on-one with members and their case managers to develop and accomplish personal goals. CE sessions focus on empowering people to access and engage with their community, to pursue personal interests, and build personal connections.

CE is a Washington State DSHS/DDA waiver service that VK is contracted to provide.


### Specialized Habilitation

This is a highly-personalized program that helps individuals pursue their goals in any of five focus areas: Self-Empowerment; Safety & Self-Advocacy; Social Communication; Coping Skills for Everyday Challenges; and/or Adaptive Skills for Daily Tasks.

SH is a Washington State DSHS/DDA waiver service that VK is contracted to provide.


## **Financial Overview**

Our income and expenses from the past year tell the story of VK building back from the worst impacts of the pandemic. We added a Skilled Nursing contract with DDA and hired a Registered Nurse on staff, enhancing our ability to fill the gap in the community to serve more people with medical fragility and higher personal care needs.



#### 2022 Donor Data






## Our 2023 Goals


